## **Our Message**

#### April

The Cumberland Barristers Society partnered with us to offer a Wills and Estate information session at the Springhill Library. Local lawyer William Fairbanks provided the expertise.

The Library received a Positive Aging grant of \$3,500, to start a volunteer home delivery service in Springhill. The money was used to train staff and volunteers, advertise, create guidelines, and recruit both volunteers and users of the service.

Community Classes in Amherst and Springhill continue to be successful. This spring we offered rug hooking and writing & publishing classes in Amherst, and crochet, scrapbooking, and genealogy classes in Springhill.

#### May

The 2014 Hackmatack Children's Choice Award winner Ashley Spires visited Amherst, Springhill, and Oxford libraries. A total of 199 children had the opportunity to learn how Spires creates picture books and the Binky the Space Cat graphic novel series.

Parrsboro received a new book drop. The Library did this to keep up with the improvements the Town of Parrsboro has made to the building, including a new metal roof.

#### June

Summer Reading Club kicked off with a series of exciting programs that tied into the year's "Eureka" (Make) theme. A total of 89 kids attended Summer Reading Club Kick-off Parties throughout the county.

- Advocate Canada Day celebration, where kids made a Canadian-themed banner to hang in the library.
- Amherst Maker Fair, where kids could play piano with bananas using Makey Makey technology, make Rainbow Loom creations, build LEGO structures, and more.
- Oxford Make like a Monkey, where kids made monkey crafts and monkeyed around.
- Parrsboro Seamonster Seaworld, where kids made sea creature habitats.
- Pugwash Make a suncatcher.
- River Hebert Make a Reading Buddy puppet.
- Springhill Scavenger hunt, carnival games, and cupcake decorating.

The Town of Amherst provided the Four Fathers Library with more sports equipment to loan to the public, including fishing poles, tents, basket & soccer balls, and more.

#### July

Debra Komar read from her book The Ballad of Jacob Peck and discussed forensic investigations.

#### **August**

Inspired by the children's book series Origami Yoda by Tom Angleberger, Cumberland Public Libraries challenged the residents of Cumberland County to fold 1000 origami Yodas starting June 2<sup>nd</sup> until the end of August. By the end of the summer, this goal was not just reached – it was tripled! 3529 origami Yodas were made by people of all ages from Cumberland County and beyond. It was a program that surpassed every one of our expectations.

#### September

CPL hosted NSLA/LBANS Conference. Over 100 library staff and trustees were in attendance to learn about the funding formula, community led libraries, graphic novels, and more.

#### October

Alzheimer's Association of Nova Scotia offered Healthy Brain workshops in the Advocate, Amherst, Oxford, Pugwash, River Hebert, and Springhill libraries.

NNELS (National Network of Equitable Library Service) and the La Leche League book and DVD collections were launched in libraries around the province.

#### November

CPL hosted our first annual 12 Days of Cookies, where staff made cookies for patrons and gave them recipes.

#### December

Another successful year for Food for Fines, adding over 700 food items to food banks around Cumberland County and forgiving over \$1,400 in fines.

The Springhill library hosted Alan Syliboy's multimedia art piece The Thundermaker from December 2<sup>nd</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>.

A new Strategic Plan was introduced for CPL for 2015-2018.
